



LAKE MOUNTAIN SKI PATROL – NEW MEMBER PROCEDURE

- 1 The prospective patroller to complete and submit to the Secretary the “Expression of Interest” form which can be located on the Lake Mountain Ski Patrol (LMSP) [website](#).
- 2 The prospective patroller is invited to Lake Mountain, to meet and observe the patrol in action and is placed on the roster. They do not actively administer first aid and do not receive or wear a patrol uniform.
A minimum of two days observation is required.
- 3 A formal application is completed which needs to include the nomination of two full members of LMSP. This is then presented to the LMSP committee. The committee members need to be satisfied the person is suitably qualified and of good character. This may be done through personal contact or by contacting referees.
- 4 When the application is reviewed by committee the result is conveyed to the prospective patroller by the Secretary. If accepted, the prospective patroller then needs to be available for the Lake Mountain Alpine Resort (LMAR) induction program. Currently this includes a drug and alcohol test also Working with Children and Police checks.

When accepted by LMAR, appropriate LMSP clothing is issued and the prospective patroller is placed on the roster as a “trainee”

- 5 The trainee completes the Australian Ski Patrol Association (ASPA) course (within three years) as well as the LMSP Training Package and annual Lake Mountain Alpine Resort competencies. Generally, at least one season is completed as a trainee.
- 6 The committee promotes the trainee to patroller status, based on the demonstration of satisfactory experience and competency.
